
Introduction



The National Ambulance LGBT Network held their first conference at the Amex Stadium, Brighton on 5 August 2016.

87 delegates from all the over the UK attended the event, representing all 11 of the NHS ambulance services.

Each delegate was asked to fill in an Evaluation and Equality Monitoring Form at the end of the event.



Responses

- A total of 87 delegate packs where issued at the start of the day. Each containing a conference Evaluation Form and Equality Monitoring Form.
- We received **56** responses from the conference Evaluation Form (representing 64% of attendees).
- We received 60 responses from the Equality Monitoring Form (representing 69% of attendees).
- The results follow on the following slides.



What Did People Find Useful?



Delegate Feedback



Most of the feedback from the delegates was extremely positive and celebratory. We have noted a small number of comments offering positive suggestions for future events:

- Increased advertising for the event and circulation around the different Trusts. There seems to have been some disparity in how each Trust disseminated the invitations.
- Use of microphones throughout the event and possible use of repeater screens for the main presentations.
- Some delegates preferenced more workshops whereas others seems to prefer the key notes speakers. We conclude that a mixture of events will engage most people.
- Invite more senior managers, non-LGBT colleagues and offer places to Student Paramedic programmes.



Lessons Learnt



Event organisers and facilitators have also offered some feedback from the event:

- Improve the registration process to cut down on administration resource requirement, maybe Eventbrite or Survey Monkey.
- Explore the use of online booking facilities for conference and accommodation. A disproportionate amount of time was spent on this.
- Spread workload across all Trusts as just three Trusts were involved in organising this one. Manage the event as a project.
- Identify funding earlier in the year and maintain contact with sponsors.
- Identify a single contact in each Trust to co-ordinate attendance.
- Not to have goodie bags too much resource required to make these.
 Suggest one quality product for each delegate in future.


No attendance fees were charged to delegates at this years conference.

We are very grateful to all these companies, who have contributed £4,000 to this years conference.








Age, Religion and Belief






Gender Identity




Sexual Orientation


Are your day to day activities limited because of health issues or disability which has lasted or expected to last at least 12 months?
